FATIMA CENTENNIAL

Pope Francis has granted an indulgence opportunity from November 27, 2016 through November 26, 2017 in celebration of the 100th Anniversary Year of the Fatima apparitions. He will be visiting Fatima on May 13, 2017 joining in the 100th Anniversary of the Fatima apparitions to the three young children, Lucia Santos, Jacinta and Francisco Marto in 1917.

The Carmelites have a special link to this popular Catholic Devotion.

During the last vision of our Lady to the shepherd children on October 13th, Mary appeared as our Lady of Mount Carmel.

At The National Shrine of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel in Middletown, NY, we have the historic statue from Portugal acquired by the Province of Saint Elias, created by the famous sculptor, Jose Ferreira Thedim which is based on Sr. Lucia's description of how our Lady looked during the last vision at Fatima.

A statue of Our Lady of Fatima will also be placed in the church and will remain there as well for the duration of the Centennial year.

WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

Saturday, February 11th is **World Day of the Sick**, and the **Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes**. This feast day of the Roman Catholic Church was instituted on May 13, 1992 by Pope John Paul II.

Beginning on February 11, 1993, it is celebrated every year on the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes, for all believers seeks to be "a special time of prayer and sharing, of offering one's suffering".

Pope John Paul II had been diagnosed with Parkinson's disease as early as 1991, an illness which was only disclosed later, and it is significant that he decided to create a World Day of the Sick only one year after his diagnosis. The Pope had written a great deal on the topic of suffering and believed that it was very much a salvific and redeeming process through Christ, as he indicated in his apostolic letter *Salvifici Doloris*.

The feast of Lourdes was chosen because many pilgrims and visitors to Lourdes have reportedly been healed by intercessions of the Blessed Virgin. The pontiff was also fond of the sanctuary of Harissa in Lebanon. In 2005, the World Day of the Sick had a special significance since it was the year John Paul died from a sepsis. Many people had gathered around him as he lay dying. In 2013, Pope Benedict XVI announced his resignation during this feast day, and he cited his declining health as his reason for retiring.

A Mass will be celebrated at 12:00noon at The National Shrine of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, 70 Carmelite Drive, Middletown, NY for anyone wishing to come & pray with us.

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

His Word Today by Rev. William J. Reilly

“Thus says the Lord: Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked when you see them, and do not turn your back on your own... you are the salt of the earth... you are the light of the world.”

It is hard for us to escape the direct teaching of Jesus and the prophet Isaiah. A familiar biblical question ‘what are we to do?’ finds a ready answer in these two scripture sources.

What Christian cannot be moved when we see images of the millions of refugees fleeing the wars in Iraq and Syria, drowning in the Mediterranean. How few Christians respond with compassion and empathy, afraid to take the risk to care for suffering humanity. Do I forget that they too are made in the image and likeness of God? Even if some have less than noble intentions, do we let all suffer?

How is it I live as salt of the earth? How can I be light of the world? Agencies do incredible work aiding those in need. Our church is at the forefront. Consider Jesuit Refugee Services, Catholic Relief Services, Doctors Without Borders, CNEWA and Aid to the Church in Need and countless others responding generously. Why do I sit back as others need the salt and light that we are?

More than the financial aid you might give is the attitude of grave concern in these moments of crisis.

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 58:7-10

This reading is a vigorous exhortation from the prophet Isaiah to lead lives of active charity and generosity. He promises that the Lord will be our “dawn,” our “rear guard,” our “light” if we share our bread, shelter the homeless, and clothe the naked.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:1-5

Paul tells the Corinthians that he and they must not rely on the so-called “wisdom” of secular teaching and philosophy but on the power of the Spirit.

Gospel: Matthew 5:13-16

Jesus reminds the disciples and all Christians that they carry special responsibilities to be “the salt of the earth.” They must not hide their light but show their goodness to all.

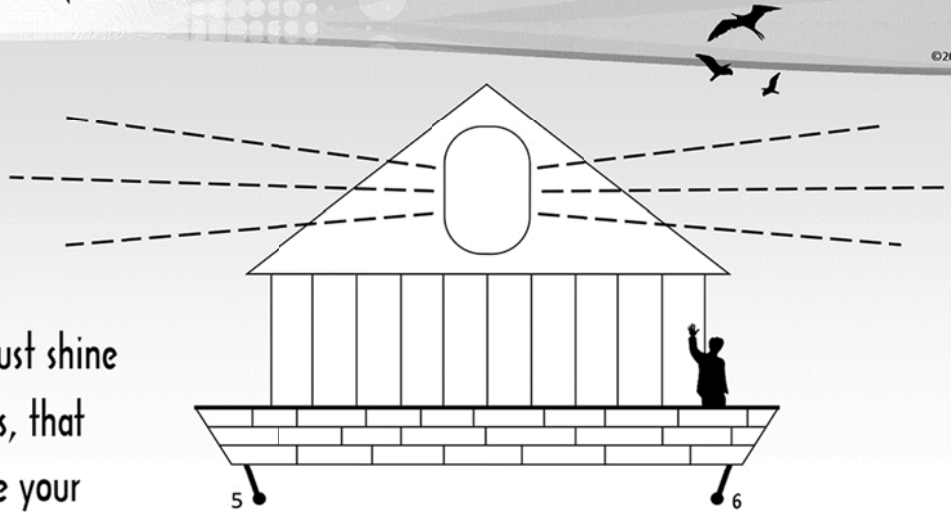

Jesus says let your good deeds shine on others like a light shining out in the darkness.

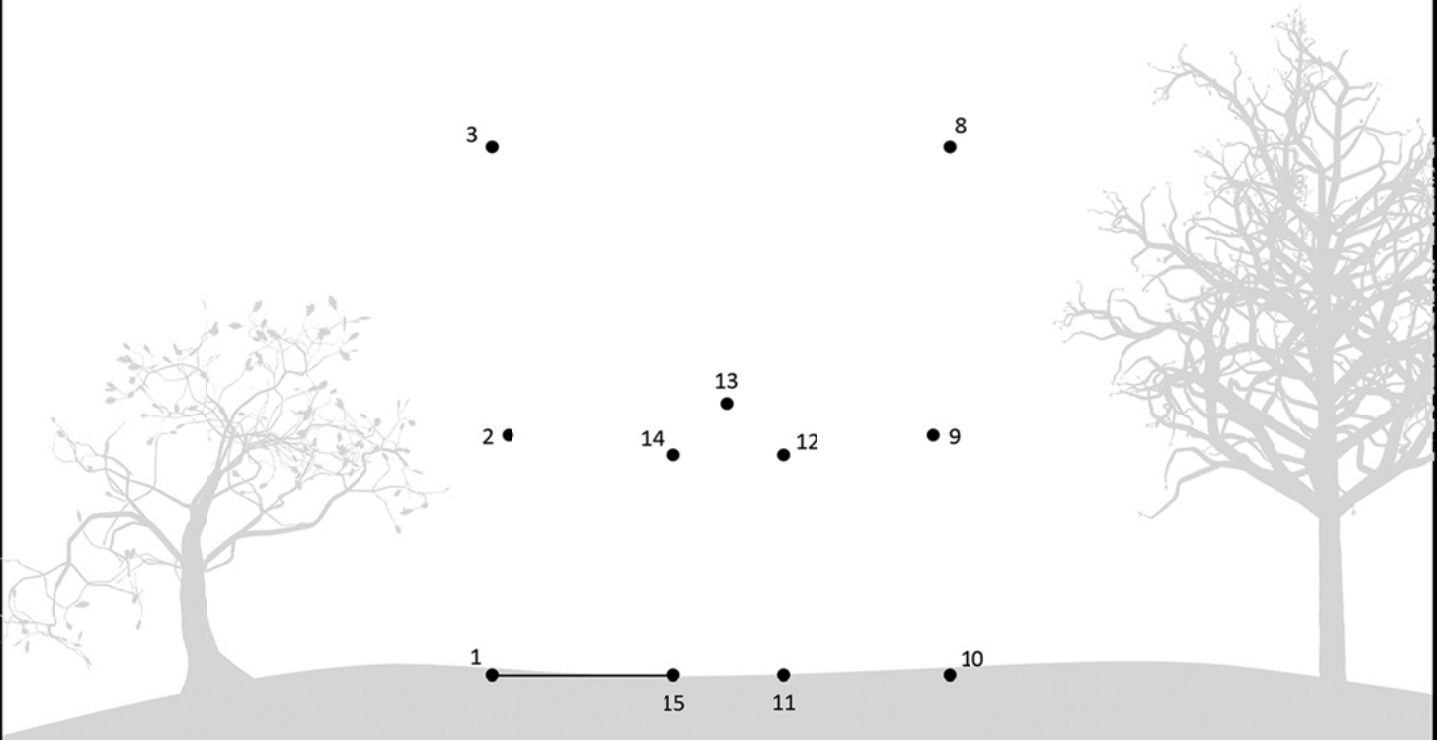
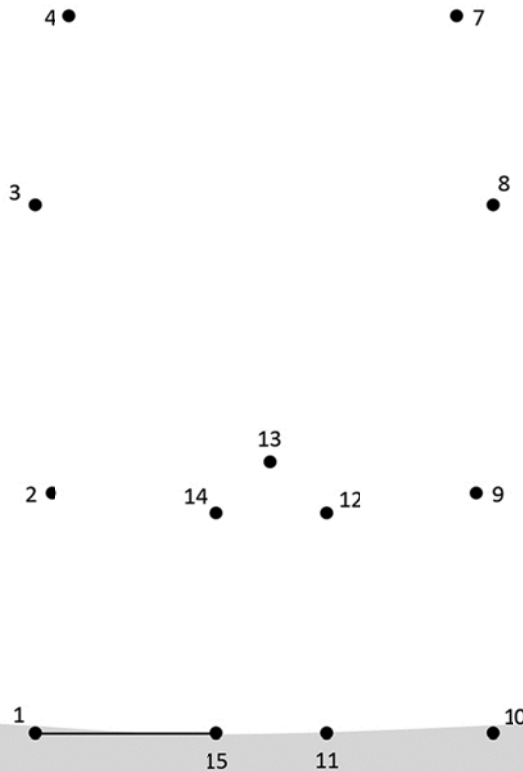
