## Second Sunday of Easter or Sunday of Divine Mercy

*"They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers... All who believed were together and had all things in common... Every day they devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple area and to breaking bread in their homes... and every day the Lord added to their numbers."*

Such a description seems 'too good to be true' but this is the description of the first disciples of the Lord. The teaching of the apostles, the kerygma, telling of the resurrection of Jesus and His victory gave their discipleship new meaning. Like a family, they formed a support group, sharing joy, as well as fears, anxieties and triumphs because Christ was alive. The Eucharist became the common bond, uniting them with Christ and one another. Prayer became a binding force.

Can I not see that my life in my parish, my small group, is a mirror of those described by St. Luke or of those gathered in the upper room? Can the presence of Christ in my life, lead me to recognize His presence in others? Can I truly believe that I am not alone in my faith and move from 'God and me' to 'God and we?' On Divine Mercy Sunday, it can happen.

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## The Divine Mercy Message and Devotion

The God's mercy is one of the greatest attribute of God. God in His Divine Love and Mercy does not want death of anyone but he wants us to live with Him forever in heaven. The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. God loves us — all of us. He wants us to recognize His mercy which is greater than our sins, to repent for our sins, to call upon Him with trust, and receive His mercy. Jesus also wants the Divine Mercy to flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His love and joy.

This message of The Divine Mercy and devotion was given by Jesus to Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of the revelations she received about God's mercy.

Among all of the elements of devotion to The Divine Mercy requested by our Lord through St. Faustina, the Feast of Mercy holds first place. Jesus told St. Faustina that this Feast of Mercy would be a very special day when "*all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened*". (Diary 699) Our Lord made a great promise to all those souls who would go to Confession and then receive Him in Holy Communion on the Feast of Mercy, on the Sunday after Easter, which is now called Divine Mercy Sunday. Jesus promised that "*The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment.*"(Diary 699) About the feast day "Divine Mercy Sunday", Jesus said "*tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon the souls who approach the Fount of My Mercy. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet.... Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy*". (Diary 699)

Veneration of the Image of The Divine Mercy, which Our Lord requested (especially on Divine Mercy Sunday) is another form of devotion. Pope John Paul II said that the image portrays the Risen Jesus Christ bringing Mercy to the whole world. Our Lord said "*I want the image to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter, and I want it to be venerated publicly so that every soul may know about it. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish*". (Diary 341, 48). Jesus said to St. Faustina "*I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You*". (Diary 327) "*The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the cross. ...Happy is the one who will dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him.*" (Diary 299)

Divine mercy chaplet is another form of devotion. Jesus wants us –if it is possible- to pray this chaplet at 3 o'clock in the time when he was dying on the cross. This prayer has enormous power and it can bring us lots of graces. Jesus said to St. Faustina: "*Encourage souls to say the Chaplet which I have given you. Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at hour of death....When they say this chaplet in presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person not as the Judge but as Merciful Savior.... My mercy is infinite. I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those souls who trust in My mercy....Through the Chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for is compatible with My will.*" (Diary 687)

The novena is another form of devotion and good way to prepare ourselves for the Solemnity of Divine Mercy Sunday. Jesus wants us to start the novena on Good Friday and through the ninth consecutive days to pray to Divine Mercy.

I want to encourage everyone to take advantage of this incredible promise and graces we can obtain through the devotion to Divine Mercy. Especially I encourage you to prepare yourself and participate in "Divine Mercy Sunday" celebration and to fully benefit from these promises.
