**FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER**

*“Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Holy Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word... They presented these men to the apostles who prayed and laid hands on them.”*

The needs of the early church were not different from those of our day. The text from the Acts of the Apostles informs us of the call by the apostles and the acceptance of the deacons to respond and serve at table.

In many parts of our country men will be ordained to the diaconate and the priesthood as they are called to Holy Orders. The mission is the same, to serve and preach the word. The mandate is no different, but in the words of Pope Francis they are to go out to the marginalized and bring the word of Jesus to others.

How many of us just accept our ordained ministers, but how few of us promote vocations to the service of the church. How many of us affirm those who are in ministry and how few consider the call of the Lord, whether in ordained or ministry of service. Jesus, the way, and the truth and the life calls us as His disciples to minister and serve. What is He asking me to do?

## 100th Anniversary of Appearance of Blessed Virgin Mary in Fatima

May is a month which is especially dedicated to Our Lady Mother of God. On May 13, this year we also celebrate 100th anniversary of the first appearance of Blessed Virgin in Fatima, Portugal. The Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, appeared 6 times to 3 shepherd children; Lucia, Francisco, and Jacinta; between May 13 and October 13, 1917. She came to the little village of Fatima which had remained faithful to the Catholic Church during the recent persecutions by the government. Our Lady came with a message of peace from God to all people. Coming at a time when civilization was torn by war and bloody violence, she promised that Heaven would grant peace to all the world if Her requests for prayer, reparation and consecration were heard and obeyed. She said that war is a consequence of our sins and our egoism, and we can stop a war by praying Rosary every day, by conversion and by reparation for our sins.

In all Her appearances at Fatima, Our Mother repeatedly emphasized the necessity of praying the Rosary daily, of wearing the Brown Scapular of Mount Carmel and of performing acts of reparation and sacrifice.

Our Lady's Message to the world is contained in what has come to be called the 'Secret'. The Secret actually consists of three parts, the first two of which have been revealed. The first part of the Secret was a horrifying vision of hell "where the souls of poor sinners go" and contained an urgent plea from Our Lady for acts of prayer and sacrifice to save souls. The second part of the Secret told of the outbreak of World War II and asked for the Consecration of Russia as a condition of world peace. It also predicted the triumph of Her Immaculate Heart following Russia's consecration and conversion. The last part of the Secret (often called the "Third Secret") was wrote down by sister Lucia in 1944 and is in the possession of the Holy See.

As a great sign of the whole message truly coming from God, a marvelous miracle was worked in the sky above Fatima before 70,000 witnesses on October 13, 1917 at the time, date and place that Lucy and the other two children had prophesized in the name of Our Lady of Fatima. The children were told by Our Lady that God would perform a miracle so that people would believe in the apparitions. The date the children was October 13, 1917, in Fatima. On that date, 70,000 people came to see the phenomenon. The miracle occurred with the sun. All could stare perfectly at the sun without blinking, or even hurting their eyes. While all were watching the sun, it rotated, got large and small, got close to the people, and got far away from them. The sun "danced ". Every single person who was there testified to seeing the sun dance, even non- believers.

The Catholic Church has officially endorsed the Fatima Message as worthy of belief since 1930. Pope John Paul II has publicly credited Our Lady of Fatima for saving his life during the assassination attempt in 1981. The following year, he went to Fatima to give thanks for Her intervention.

On March 25, 1984 on the feast of Annunciation Pope John Paul II consecrated Russia to Immaculate Heart of Mary to comply with Mary's request. Inspired by this event and celebrating 100 anniversary of appearances of Our Lady in Fatima our Bishop Arthur J. Serratelli consecrated our Diocese to Immaculate Heart of Mary on May 13, this Saturday Morning, after the Mass of ordination to diaconate in St. Philip Church in Clifton. To express our unity with our Bishop after every mass during this weekend priests together with lay people throughout the whole diocese will read the act of consecration to Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Encouraged by those events and message of Our Lady let us together with our Bishop and with all people in Diocese of Paterson consecrate our Parish and ourselves to Immaculate Heart of Mary. Let this act of consecration be for us an inspiration for deeper relation with Our Blessed Mother and let it strengthen our spiritual life.

## FROM THE DESK OF FR. JAN,



This weekend we can take great joy in the fact that we are hosting our Bishop Arthur Serratelli who will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation in our Parish. This Saturday Fifteen students are receiving the great seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. These High School students have made decision to confirm their commitment to the faith. It is encouraging and a true blessing to the Church that they realize the grace offered by Confirmation and how it will help them in faith journey.

There is a great excitement for each of our high school students who receive the special graces of the sacrament as they are sealed with the Holy Spirit.

The Sacrament of Confirmation impresses a character on each of us, for one is enriched by the gift of the Holy Spirit and is bound more perfectly to the Church. It strengthens each recipient of the sacrament, as it obliges them more firmly to be witnesses to Christ by word and deed, and to spread and defend the faith.

Confirmation is a sacrament of initiation as one passes into the life of adult Christian witness. The Catechism tells us that there is a deepened presence of the Spirit, who comes to us in order to sustain us in a lifetime of witness to Christ and service to others. The Gift that we receive in this sacrament is the Spirit himself.

So who is this Holy Spirit that plays such a significant role in our lives?

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity who is coeternal and coequal with the Father and the Son. It is the Father and the Son who sends forth the Spirit. Though the world cannot see Him, He speaks to us through the prophets of old and dwells within all of us, if we believe in Him and Jesus.

It is the Holy Spirit that inspired the Scriptures, inspires and assists the Church Magisterium, intercedes for us through prayer. Puts us into communion with Christ at the sacred liturgy, builds up the Church and is found in the signs of apostolic and missionary life.

The Holy Spirit imparts on us the spirits and gifts of: Understanding, Wisdom, Fortitude, Knowledge, Counsel, Piety and Holy Fear in God's Presence.

The Holy Spirit is someone who should not be ignored or denied for the Spirit of God. As St. John of Damascus said: "the Spirit of God is direct authoritative, the fountain of wisdom, life, and holiness." Additionally in Galatians 4:6 we find: "God has sent the Spirit of His Son into our hearts crying, Abba! Father!"

We congratulate each of our young men and women who will be confirmed. As we now await Pentecost, let us gravitate to the Third Person of the Trinity. May we let the Spirit dwell in our hearts and direct our actions. Seek the Spirit's help to guide you to God the Father and to God the Son. May our tongues, souls, and mind be on fire with the Holy Spirit. Let us share in joy of the newly confirmed and realize how awesome the Spirit is in our life.

## FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

### **First Reading: Acts 6:1-7**

During the early growth of the Church, the apostles realized that they needed more disciples in order to carry out effectively the ministry of the Church. The community selected seven men, one of whom was Stephen.

### **Second Reading: 1 Peter 2:4-9**

Citing many uses of the word "stone" in the sayings of Jesus and in the Old Testament, Peter urges the Christians to be "living stones...an edifice of spirit."

### **Gospel: John 14:1-12**

In this beautiful passage from the words of Jesus at the Last Supper, Jesus promises that he is preparing a place for the apostles. He tells them, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through me." When Philip asks Jesus to show them the Father, Jesus answers, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father."
