

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

Peter preaches to the Gentiles for the first time in the house of Cornelius. Peter realized that God would accept any person who acted uprightly, regardless of his or her heritage. Then the Holy Spirit descended on the Gentiles and Peter allowed them to be baptized in the name of Jesus.

Second Reading: I John 4:7-10

John advises all believers to love one another, for love is a gift from God. The person without love does not know God, whose love for us is so great he sent his only son so that we might have life through him.

Gospel: John 15:9-17

Jesus asks his disciples to live on in his love and to "Love one another as I have loved you." He explains that he chose them to follow him, and promises if they keep his commandments they will have anything that they ask for in his name.

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

Sixth Sunday of Easter
May 6, 2018

"Jesus said to his disciples, 'As the Father loves Me, so I also love you. Remain in My love. If you keep My commandments, you will remain in My love, just as I have kept the Father's commandments and remain in His love... This is My commandment: love one another as I love you... It was not you who chose Me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain... This I command you: love one another.'"

In His prayer Jesus is preparing the disciples for their work when He takes leave of them. How frequently John's gospel uses the word 'remain', stay close, be cemented, don't stray. Besides telling them what to do, He assures them that He too will be part of their lives for He loves, not just loved them.

He then gives them the task to put into action, to go and bear fruit. Am I unsure or afraid what the Lord asks of me? I shouldn't be, because I am both loved by Him at this moment, and He has both chosen me and appointed me. He is waiting for my response.

FROM THE DESK OF FR. JAN

This Sunday five members of our community for the first time will fully participate in the Holy Eucharist because they, for the first time in their life, will receive Jesus into their hearts in Holy Communion. It is a time of great joy for them, but also for our community, that those children together with us will fully benefit from the graces Jesus offered for those coming to his table.

Jesus Christ, savior of whole human race established the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist to be with us throughout. During the Last supper, Jesus took bread and wine, gave thanks to God (*Eucharist* is a Greek word for thanksgiving), beseeched God to bless it, and distributed it with these astounding and eternal words: "This bread is my body. This wine is my blood. Every time you eat this bread and drink this wine in my name, I will be present with you."

It is not only the Last Supper, but also Crucifixion, Death and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ that we commemorate through the sacrament of Holy Eucharist. The catechism states that "(in the Eucharist) Christ associates his church and all her members with his sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving offered once for all on the cross to his father; by his sacrifice he pours out the graces of salvation on his body which is the church." (No. 1407) The Eucharist is the crucified and risen Christ, present under the species of bread and wine. It is a true banquet, in which Christ offers himself as our nourishment.

It is impossible to understand the life of the church and our life without the Eucharist. The Second Vatican Council reminds us that the Eucharist is at the very center of our worship of God and our life as a people of God. Eucharist is the most perfect and important act of worship offered to God our Father, because in the Eucharist it is Jesus Christ, our High Priest who is offering Himself to the Father for our sins. Jesus offers his life to man through the Eucharist. The Eucharist is the eternal sacrifice of Christ made present to us sacramentally.

When we celebrate the Eucharist, we enter into the presence of God and we relive the mysteries of Our Lord's Life. Throughout the Eucharist we grow in our awareness of our sinfulness and also of His healing Love. Only if we experience the living presence of Jesus at the altar we can pray and celebrate the Eucharist with faith. Otherwise the Eucharist will not have much meaning for us especially if we stand far away and astray, we will not be able to participate fully in the Eucharistic celebration. The Eucharist is the highest form of Prayer where we become aware of the living presence of God and where we receive His peace and healing.

It is in the Eucharist we find nourishment for our souls (which need "spiritual food" like our body needs material food) and the possibility for spiritual growth and a healthy spiritual life. During Eucharist we receive the spiritual strength to do good. Mother Teresa often used to say that she received the inner strength and power to serve the poorest of poor from the Holy Eucharist. Such inner strength and power we need also to fight the deceptive temptations of evil that wants to mislead or to lead us astray.

So come let us reflect for a while and make a firm decision to participate with utmost devotion and a firm Faith in Jesus our Lord every Sunday Eucharist. We can show the world and be a witness to Jesus Christ, our redeemer, only if we are able to participate in the celebration of Holy Eucharist regularly as truly faithful Catholics.
